## About the event

The Institute of Foreign Languages of the Faculty of Philology of Vilnius University and the Public Service Language Center together with the coordinators of the project – University of Western Macedonia (Greece) and project partners: the University of Applied Sciences Emden/Leer (Germany), the University of Évora (Portugal), the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) (Romania), the Experimental Primary School of Florina (Greece), the Orgadata AG (Germany), and the Atlantic Veterinary Hospital (Portugal) have been implementing the Erasmus Strategic Partnership Project *Thinking for Successful Jobs - Think4Jobs* (2020-1-EL01-KA203-078797).

The project brings together a multidisciplinary team representing higher education institutions and labour market organisations focusing on the development of critical thinking skills in five different areas: teacher education, IT, economics, veterinary medicine, and foreign language teaching for the effective promotion, development, support, and assessment of students' critical thinking.
